What exactly is Attention? What is not Attention?

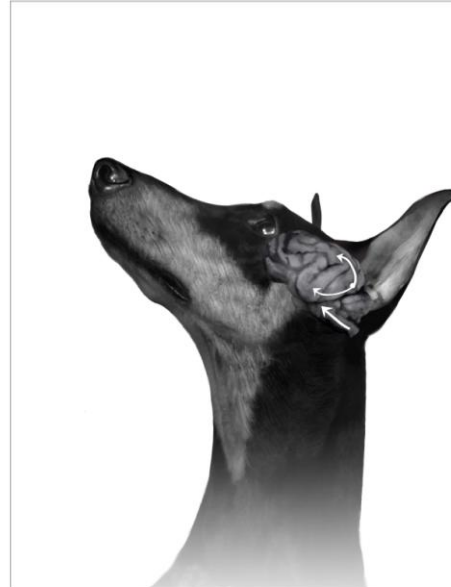
What non-training methods will improve Attention? (Supplements, etc.) How do they work?
